# Rules Governing This Department: Please Read All Rules Carefully

- A. Registration for Open Class Beef Cattle will take place online and by mail. Online Entries open June1st and close July 23<sup>rd</sup> at 9:00am. Mail in Entries must be into the Fairboard Office by 3:00pm on Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup> 2023. We are not responsible for delay or loss of mailed entries.
- B. All Exhibitors must pay admittance at the Gate-NO exhibitors pass required.
- C. Entry Fee: \$8.00 per entry in County, by Open Class Entry Deadline. For all Day of Show & Out of County entries, \$10.00 per entry. Fees must be paid at time of entry. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name. Do not reserve more stalls/pens than needed. If additional housing is reserved and cannot be accommodated, fees will not be refunded.
- Livestock trailers will not be permitted to park in the infield fair week. Trailers must be moved off the fairgrounds after 12:00 a.m., Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>,2023.
- E. Any exhibitor making a protest against another exhibitor shall deposit \$200.00 with the Secretary at the time of making the complaint and if protest is not sustained will be forfeited.
- All Jr. Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- G. All animals must be exhibited in show ring and judged, even in absence of competition, in order to be awarded premium.
- H. Exhibitors must furnish own bedding.
- I. No chutes or canopies are permitted between any buildings.
- J. No Cooking in barns.

- ⇒ Open Class Market Beef Not exhibiting in Jr. Fair will be release on Sunday July 24<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm or After the Open Class Market Beef Show.

#### MARKET RULES:

- A. Animals can be groomed by anyone.
- B. Exhibitor must comply with all the general rules of the Cattle Department.
- C. Animals must be owned by exhibitor at least 90 days prior to the opening date of the fair.
- D. All market beef animals must be halter broken.
- E. Any exhibitor may enter and show a maximum of two steers or market heifers or combination of the two.
- F. Code of Ethics: To maintain a high degree of confidence in the livestock show, THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DISQUALIFY ANY ANIMALS THAT HAVE BEEN FITTED IN AN UNETHICAL MANNER. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid, or liquid under the skin to alter the normal conformation. It shall include also, any cutting or tearing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal. It shall also include attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development as well as the dyeing or coloring of individuals which alters their natural coloration; also artificial tail heads or polls. Any attempts to change the degree of firmness of any individual shall also be considered unethical. Any persons guilty of the above will be disqualified and barred from future shows.
- G. No grooming chutes allowed in aisles in Beef Barn.
- H. Classes will be determined after weigh-in.

If entries are mailed, you may check with the fair board office at 513.892.1423 to see if they have been received before the deadline. We are not responsible for delay or loss of mailed entries.
- B. Open Class exhibitors must purchase a Society Membership, 4-Day Pass or 7-Day Pass, except Butler County Jr. Fair Exhibitors who are entering their Junior Fair Animals. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior Fair Exhibitor's name.
- C. Stall rental is \$5.00 per head unless it is a 4-H or FFA project Entry Fee \$8.00 per entry. Fees must be paid at time of entry. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name. Do not reserve more stalls/pens than needed. If additional housing is reserved and cannot be accommodated, fees will not be refunded.
- Livestock trailers will not be permitted to park in the infield fair week. Trailers must be moved off the fairgrounds after 12:00 a.m., Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> 2023.
- E. Any exhibitor making a protest against another exhibitor shall deposit \$200.00 with the Secretary at the time of making the complaint and if protest is not sustained will be forfeited.

### All Rules for Section 1

\*\*\*\*NO Breed Classes\*\*\*\*

- A. All market goats will be ear tagged with Butler County ear tags at weigh in. All market goats will be weighed on Saturday July 21<sup>st</sup> from 1:00 P.M.-3:00 P.M.
- B. All market goats must have their milk teeth intact. Any market goat missing milk teeth will be disqualified.
- C. Ideally all market goats should have been disbudded or have their horns have been disbudded or have their horns cut back to approximately 1 inch in length. However, if market goats

- are shown without being disbudded they should have horn tips cut off in a blunt manner,
- D. All animals must have a scrapie tag or tattoos with official registration papers, which match. Implants are acceptable but you must provide your own reader. All animals must be tagged, tattooed, or implanted before arriving on the Fairgrounds.
- E. All market goats will be checked by the fair board member in charge.
- F. Any animals showing signs of sore mouth, pinkeye, open abscesses or open sores will be prohibited from unloading, pending vet examination.
- G. No uncastrated male market goats are allowed on grounds.
- H. Exhibitors may bring a maximum of two Market Goats to the Fair .(Include Jr. Fair animals in total).
- All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- J. All Goats must have water available 24/7.
- K. All classes will be set by weight.
- L. All market goats will be divided into classes of approximately 15 to 20 according to weights, with each group having approximately the same number.
- M. Market Classes will be broken down into weight divisions to allow for a fair final drive. Divisions will be determined after weigh-in.

- F. Any exhibitor making a protest against another exhibitor shall deposit \$200.00 with the Secretary at the time of making the complaint and if protest is not sustained will be forfeited.
- G. All animals must be exhibited in show ring and judged, even in absence of competition, in order to be awarded premium.
- H. All Jr. Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- Exhibitors must furnish own bedding. No straw furnished.
   Straw and wood shavings Only type of bedding permitted.
- J. Exhibitors must furnish1"x6"x4'8"kick board on all pens along aisles.

- L. An exhibitor must not place any obstruction in the aisles and must keep them clean. All show boxes must be located with the exhibitors pens.
- M. Exhibitor must be 6 years old (day of show) or older to show.
- N. No Cooking in barns.

# **Rules for Section 1**

# \*\*\*\*NO Breed Classes\*\*\*\*

- A. Hogs must have been farrowed after January 1st, 2023.
- B. Exhibitors may bring a maximum of two market hogs to the fair. (Include Jr. Fair animals in total.)
- C. Market hogs will be weighed and tagged Saturday, July 22<sup>rd</sup> from 7:30 a.m. to 12:30p.m. Each exhibitor must be with his/her own animals at this time. All hogs under 220 lbs or over 300 lbs must be removed from fairgrounds by 10:00 p.m. Saturday.
- D. All entries will be judged by weight classes with all breeds showing together. All hogs not going though the Jr. Fair sale need to be removed from the fairgrounds Tuesday night, after the Jr. Fair Show. All pigs remaining on the grounds will go to the packer.
- E. Weight Classes for market hogs will be divided as evenly as possible with approximately 18-20 per class. The number of show classes will be determined once all hogs are weighed and processed.

### Rules for Section 2

- A. Registration Certificates for all Purebred Market Hogs are REQUIRED from respective Breed Assn.
- B. Original Certificate Required. No Copies Accepted, this will be shown at time of weigh-in.
- C. Registration certificates must be in Exhibitors name as owner, transferred by entry due date.
- D. All purebred market hogs to be ear notched. (Universal System)
- E. Breed Purity Verification by Sr./Jr. Fair Board.
- F. All market hog entries not meeting the purebred requirement will be permitted to enter as a crossbred, unless it is the exhibitors 3<sup>rd</sup> pig, at which time it is disqualified, as exhibitors are limited to a maximum of 2 crossbred entries. Animal will need to be removed from the fairgrounds by Saturday night of weigh-in.
- G. A minimum of 3 entries is required per breed or they will show crossbred. (Section 1)
- H. The champion of the Crossbred Section will be eligible for Overall Champion.
- Purebred or composite breeds not recognized by the Ohio State Fair Breeds will not be eligible for AOB classification.
- J. Class 12 is for those who are unsure which purebred class to enter.
