

## Department NO. 2 - Goat

### Rules Governing This Department:

#### Please Read All Rules Carefully

- A. Entries close and must be into the Senior Fair Board Office by 3pm. On Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Late Entries accepted until July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 3pm. With \$75/entry. If entries are mailed, you may check with the fair board office at 513.892.1423 to see if they have been received before the deadline. We are not responsible for delay or loss of mailed entries.
- B. Open Class exhibitors must purchase a Society Membership, 4-Day Pass or 7-Day Pass, except Butler County Jr. Fair Exhibitors who are entering their Junior Fair Animals. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior Fair Exhibitor's name.
- C. Stall rental is \$5.00 per head unless it is a 4-H or FFA project Entry Fee \$8.00 per entry. Fees must be paid at time of entry. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name. Do not reserve more stalls/pens than needed. If additional housing is reserved and cannot be accommodated, fees will not be refunded.
- D. Livestock trailers will not be permitted to park in the infield fair week. Trailers must be moved off the fairgrounds after 12:00 a.m., Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> 2023.
- E. Any exhibitor making a protest against another exhibitor shall deposit \$200.00 with the Secretary at the time of making the complaint and if protest is not sustained will be forfeited.
- F. All animals must be exhibited in show ring and judged, even in absence of competition, in order to be awarded premium.
- G. All Jr. Fair animals must be entered under Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- H. Exhibitors must furnish own bedding. No straw furnished. Straw and wood shavings Only type of bedding permitted.
- I. Exhibitors must furnish 1"x6"x4'8" kickboard on all pens along aisles.
- J. No Cooking in barns.
- D. All animals must have a scrapie tag or tattoos with official registration papers, which match. Implants are acceptable but you must provide your own reader. All animals must be tagged, tattooed, or implanted before arriving on the Fairgrounds.
- E. All market goats will be checked by the fair board member in charge.
- F. Any animals showing signs of sore mouth, pinkeye, open abscesses or open sores will be prohibited from unloading, pending vet examination.
- G. No uncastrated male market goats are allowed on grounds.
- H. Exhibitors may bring a maximum of two Market Goats to the Fair. (Include Jr. Fair animals in total).
- I. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- J. All Goats must have water available 24/7.
- K. All classes will be set by weight.
- L. All market goats will be divided into classes of approximately 15 to 20 according to weights, with each group having approximately the same number.
- M. Market Classes will be broken down into weight divisions to allow for a fair final drive. Divisions will be determined after weigh-in.

## All Rules for Section 1

\*\*\*\*NO Breed Classes\*\*\*\*

- A. All market goats will be ear tagged with Butler County ear tags at weigh in. All market goats will be weighed on Saturday July 21<sup>st</sup> from 1:00 P.M.-3:00 P.M.
- B. All market goats must have their milk teeth intact. Any market goat missing milk teeth will be disqualified.
- C. Ideally all market goats should have been disbudded or have their horns have been disbudded or have their horns cut back to approximately 1 inch in length. However, if market goats

are shown without being disbudded they should have horn tips cut off in a blunt manner,

- D. All animals must have a scrapie tag or tattoos with official registration papers, which match. Implants are acceptable but you must provide your own reader. All animals must be tagged, tattooed, or implanted before arriving on the Fairgrounds.
- E. All market goats will be checked by the fair board member in charge.
- F. Any animals showing signs of sore mouth, pinkeye, open abscesses or open sores will be prohibited from unloading, pending vet examination.
- G. No uncastrated male market goats are allowed on grounds.
- H. Exhibitors may bring a maximum of two Market Goats to the Fair. (Include Jr. Fair animals in total).
- I. All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior Fair exhibitor's name.
- J. All Goats must have water available 24/7.
- K. All classes will be set by weight.
- L. All market goats will be divided into classes of approximately 15 to 20 according to weights, with each group having approximately the same number.
- M. Market Classes will be broken down into weight divisions to allow for a fair final drive. Divisions will be determined after weigh-in.
