Rules Governing This Department: Please Read All Rules Carefully

- A. Livestock entries are due to the Senior Fair Board Office by June 10th 2023.
- B. NO ONE is permitted in the Barn until Thursday (before Fair) @ 7:30pm
- C. Market lambs must be born after January 1st, 2023.
- D. All lambs must have a USDA approved scrapie tag.
- E. All lambs must be docked and tagged. All male market lambs must be castrated by May 1st of current year.
- F. Mandatory Weigh-In May 12th 6pm-8pm and May 13th 10am-1pm at the Farigrounds. Market lambs will be weighed from 5:00-6:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 22nd and will only be weighed once.
- G. Market lambs must weigh at least 85 lbs.to sell.
- H. All exhibitors must put their lambs on the packer truck after they sell.
- All Market Lambs <u>must</u> be slick shorn uniform in cover, washed and trimmed before entering fairgrounds.
 Touch up shearing is permitted in the sheep barn. The owner is responsible for cleanup.
- J. Altering or enhancing the natural color of a lamb shall be considered fraud and deception. Neutral coloring (clear) only may be used. Painting of hoofs is prohibited. All animals giving evidence of such treatment will be barred from competition at the Butler County Jr. Fair
- K. Exhibitors must furnish own bedding (straw, shavings or mulch).
- L. Exhibitors have 11/2 hrs after completion of livestock show to pull animal from sale. Sale Representatives will be at podium in show ring. If not pulled by 6:00, all remaining projects will be required to be sold through the Junior Fair Livestock Sale. Both the exhibitor and the parent/guardian must sign the Livestock Auction Removal Agreement.

- M. Retention boards MUST be placed on aisle panels so that bedding stay in pens.1"x 6"x 4'8" kickboards are required on all pens along aisle.
- N. Pens may be no larger than 10 foot by 10 foot.
- O. Due to the safety of animals, pen decorations are discouraged and may be subject to removal based on the discretion of the Jr. & Sr. Fair Board members.
- P. All Jr. Fair sheep must be penned in the Jr. Fair sheep barn.
- Q. A 2-gal.and no larger than 5 gal. bucket container of fresh water must be accessible to sheep at all times.
- R. No muzzles are allowed.
- No feeding with syringes and bottles or drench gear allowed.
- T. Jr. Fair Sheep must stay within a restricted walking area. Animals are prohibited on the midway, campground areas and in-field.
- U. A member may exhibit a maximum of two market lambs, as a pen of two, and/or as individuals.
- V. All market lambs entered in Pen of 2 should have a suggested spread of not more than 10 lbs. between lambs. Lambs in the Pen of 2 Show will be divided into two equal weight classes.
- W. Weight class for market lambs will be divided evenly into classes with approximately 8-15 lambs per class. All First and Second Place lambs will go into the final champion drive. First place winners will receive a trophy. <u>Light weight class</u>- total of 2 lambs weigh 135lbs or lower. <u>Heavy weight class</u>- total of 2 lambs weigh 136lbs or higher.
- X. In the Jr. Fair Market lamb show there will be only ONE person per sheep in the showring. Exception: if exhibitor is handicapped in any way.
- Y. Pens are assigned to exhibitors by the Jr. Fair Board in charge of the Sheep Barn. It is prohibited to change pen assignments without permission from this Jr. Fair Board.
- Z. Professional groomers are **Prohibited** to fit and/or groom Jr. Fair Sheep. Only 4-H club members, family members, 4-H advisors are permitted to help groom and/or fit Jr. Fair Sheep.
- AA. Showmanship winner must declare or decline participation in Grand Showman of Showmen within 24 hours of being named Sheep Showmanship Winner.
- ⇒ Sheep Skillathon will be Friday July 20th 9am-12pm & 1pm-5pm at the Fairgrounds.

- ⇒ A member may exhibit a maximum of two in any one class.
- ⇒ All breeding sheep owners must show proper registration papers to Jr. Fair Board by 6:00 p.m. Sunday.
- ⇒ Breeding sheep must be presented and in show condition or they will be dismissed from the show.
- ⇒ All breeding sheep must have a USDA approved scrapie tag.
- ⇒ Exhibitor may be allowed help in the show ring by another Jr. Fair exhibitor (Breeding only.)
- ⇒ Market lambs may not be shown in breeding classes.

Rules for Born & Raised Show:

- A. All lambs entered in the Butler County Born and Raised Lamb show must be the progeny of a ewe that resides in the county. The lamb must be born and raised in Butler County.
- B. The exhibitor must be a Butler County Junior Fair member.
- C. The lamb must be owned and in the possession of and in the care of the exhibitor by May1 of the current year.
- D. The lamb must be purchased directly from a Butler County Sheep Associa-

- tion breeder, no second party sales.
- E. All Butler County Born and Raised Lamb show exhibitors must obey all of the Junior Fair rules concerning showing at the fair.
- F. All Born and Raised lambs (including wethers) must have an official USDA Scrapie tag.
- G. All exhibitors showina will receive awards.
- H. The Born and Raised Yearling Ewe must have been shown in the Jr. Fair Sheep Breeding Yearling Ewe class on Monday.
