# Rules Governing This Department: Please Read All Rules Carefully

- A. Registration for all open market lambs, entries will occur online and need to be submitted by 12:00pm on July 22nd, 2023. For breeding see breeding show rules. Premiums for all open classes will be available on Friday July 28th after 1:00pm. OPEN BREEDING class entries are \$8.00 per entry. OPEN MAR-KET class entries are \$8.00 per entry.
- B. Pens for sheep, \$5.00 each. It is recommended that pens be purchased. Showing out of trailer is difficult due to proximity of show ring to the parking area. Pens are to be purchased at time of registrations. Exhibitors must furnish own bedding. Straw, mulch and wood shaving are the only acceptable forms of bedding. For Pens in use for more that 1 day, exhibitors must furnish kick boards on all pens along aisles (board measure 1"x6"x4'8".
- C. All Visitors, including Exhibitors must pay admittance to the fair.
- D. Livestock Trailers will have designated parking areas within the fair grounds. Once sheep and all supplies have been unloaded, please see the member in charge for parking guidance. All trailers must be moved off of the fairgrounds property by midnight of the day of show unless given approval by a representative of the Agricultural Society Board.
- E. All animals must be led into the ring and judged in order to be awarded a premium. (even in the absence of competition)
- Cooking in the barns, and areas around the barns, is prohibit-
- G. For those choosing to show out of their trailers, generators are recommended as electric will not be available in the parking area. Water is available at the barns, but the barns are not in close proximity to the parking area. Wash racks are also available at the show barn.
- H. Any exhibitor wishing to make a protest against another exhibitor shall deposit \$200 with the Secretary at the time of making the complaint. If the protest is not sustained, then the money will be forfeited.

# Open to the World Market Lamb Show Rules:

- A. Pens to be assigned by Member in Charge.
- B. NO STOCK REMOVED until animals are released by the Member in Charge. Open Class Breeding sheep will be encouraged to leave after the Open Class Breeding Show if the exhibitor has no market animals to show. All open class only animals will be released at the conclusion of the Open Class Market Show.
- C. Classes will be shown by weight. All Junior Fair Open Market Lambs will be weighed Saturday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> from 4:30-6:30 pm. In the Open Class Sheep Barn. All others will be weighed in on Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> from 7:30am-8:30am in the Open Class Sheep Barn.
- D. All Market Lambs will be checked for an official USDA scrapie

ear tag or they will be dismissed.

- E. Market Lambs may be purebred, crossbred, or grade. All lambs must be slick shorn uniform in length. Lamb's wool is not to be longer than 1/4 inch in length. Longer wool on the lower leg is acceptable.
- F. All male market lambs must be castrated by May 1, 2023.
- All Single market lambs will be divided into classes that will be displayed prior to the beginning of the show.
- All market lambs entered in pen of two will show in the same weight class.
- All Junior Fair animals must be entered under the Junior fair exhibitors name.
- Use of drench guns and feeding syringes is prohibited.

Lead Showmanship Rules:

- A. Age Group as of January 1, 2023.
- Entrants can be exhibitors in Junior Fair or open class sheep divisions or sponsored by Open Class Exhibitors
- C. Entrants must be responsible for obtaining their own sheep to exhibit during lead class. Entrants may bring sheep the day of the show with health papers.
- D. The sheep must be ewe or wether, broken to lead on a halter and groomed in show condition. The ewe or wether must be shown in a halter. Any violations of this ruling will result in immediate disqualification of the contestant.
- E. The costumes are to be handmade or purchased of fabric or yarn that is at least 50% wool.
- F. Entrants will be judged on poise and presentation, general appearance, garment construction, and the behavior and grooming of the sheep.
- G. No decoration on animal or halter.
- H. Entry Fee \$5.00. Entries close same date as open class.

#### **BREEDING RULES: Sections 4-19**

- A. Premiums for all open classes will be available on Friday, July 29th after 1:00pm Out of county will be mailed after Friday July 29th.. OPEN BREEDING class entries are \$8.00 per class entry. Check in 7:30am-8:30am
- B. Pens for sheep are \$5.00 each. It is recommended that pens be purchased. Showing out of a trailer is difficult due to proximity of show ring to the parking area. Pens are to be purchased at the time registration. Exhibitors must furnish own bedding. Straw mulch, and wood shavings are the only acceptable forms of bedding.
- C. Fair admission is NOT included in class registration. Each person must purchase fair admission.
- D. Pens to be assigned by the Member in Charge. Do not reserve more stalls/pens than needed. If additional housing is reserved and cannot be accommodated, fees will not be refunded.
- E. NO STOCK REMOVED until animals are released by the Member in Charge. Open Class Breeding sheep will be encouraged to leave after the Open Class Breeding Show if the exhibitor has no market animals to show. All open class only animals will be released at the conclusion of the Open Class Market Show.
- F. All breeding sheep will be checked for an official USDA scrapie ear tag or they will be dismissed.
- G. All breeding sheep, with the exception of commercial class, are to be registered.
- H. All animals must be led into the ring and judged, even in the absence of competition, to be eligible for premiums.

# Fleece Rules:

- A. Entry Fee will be \$5.00 per fleece. All wool must have been shorn within the year shown.
- B. All fleeces must be in clear bags.

- C. Fleeces with excessive foreign material tags, burrs, chaff, seeds or straw, will be disqualified at the discretion of the judge.
- D. The management or individuals connected with the fleece show will not be responsible for loss or damage in any way, shape, or form of any fleece on exhibit.
- E. Fleeces will be brought to the Open Class Sheep Barn on Saturday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> 2023 from 9:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. and will be released on Sunday after the fair on July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 9:00 A.M. If your fleece is not picked up after the fair ,it will be disposed of.
- F. Judging will be held in the Open Class Sheep Barn.
